Rodriguito is a warrior in every sense of the word. He retired from his racing career with an incredible 150 starts, and has endured the wrath of not one, but two hurricanes in recent months.

Hurricane Maria, in particular, took a toll on the grounds that housed him and others at the racetrack in Puerto Rico. Roofs were ripped from the barns, leaving flooded stalls exposed as uprooted trees and other debris flew through the air.

The clearing of the skies did not bring immediate relief to the horses at the racetrack as few people returned due to the island-wide devastation. There was a severe lack of supplies, including food and water, which had to be strictly rationed.

Rodriguito was surrendered by his former owner in Puerto Rico and secured by Caribbean Thoroughbred Aftercare who had him flown to Florida before he would make his way to The Exceller Fund's facility in Oklahoma.

Despite sustaining an injury to his eye when a rock flew up during a race, Rodriguito continued in his racing career, nearly blind on his left side. This Racing Warrior has an endearing will to please and a temperament in which dreams are made.

The Exceller Fund's newest resident will enjoy some much deserved rest and relaxation. It is our turn to take care of him; he has earned it.
